known as caravanserais or 'khan', these were historic roadside inns or hotels primarily found along trade routes in the Middle East, Central Asia, and North Africa. These were the places where travellers on the Silk Road would stop with their camels and goods to trade on their way to Europe.

These structures played a crucial role in facilitating long-distance trade and travel, providing shelter, food and accommodation for travellers, merchants, and their pack animals, for drinking as well as for washing. Sometimes these inns also doubled up as a place of trade, where merchants would be able to sell their wares. The word 'caravanserai' is a Persian one wherein 'caravan' means a group of travellers journeying together and 'seray' means dwelling.

Caravanserais typically had a similar architectural layout, featuring a large central courtyard surrounded by rooms or stalls. The central courtyard was used to secure the animals and goods of the travellers. The rooms surrounding the courtyard served as accommodations for travellers and storage for their belongings. Some caravanserais also included facilities like kitchens, baths, and mosques to cater to the needs of their guests.

While the traditional caravanserais are no longer in wide use today, their historical significance and architectural charm have led to the preservation and restoration of some of these structures for tourism and historical purposes. These restored caravanserais often serve as unique and culturally rich hotels or

guesthouses where modern travellers can experience a taste of the past while enjoying comfortable accommodations. These hotels are sometimes referred to as 'caravanserai hotels' or simply 'caravanserais'.

These caravanserai hotels can be found in various countries across the historical Silk Road and trade routes. They offer an opportunity for guests to immerse themselves in the history and culture of the regions they are located in while enjoying a comfortable and unique lodging experience.

There are several well-known caravanserai hotels or historical inns that have been renovated and converted into comfortable accommodations. Here are a few notable caravanserai hotels from various regions:

Shah Abbasi Caravanserai Hotel,

Isfahan, Iran: Located in the beautiful city of Isfahan, this caravanserai has been transformed into a charming hotel. It offers a glimpse of Persian architecture and culture and is known for its historical ambiance.

The Great Silk Road Bukhara Boutique Hotel, Bukhara, Uzbekistan: Located in the historic city of Bukhara, this former caravanserai has been transformed into a charming boutique hotel, allowing guests to immerse themselves in the city's rich history.

Al Moudira Hotel, Luxor, Egypt: This unique hotel in Luxor, Egypt, was built using traditional mud bricks and has a distinct Nubian design. It provides a peaceful and culturally rich retreat near the ancient temples of Luxor.

Caravanserai Kervansaray Hotel, Cappadocia, Turkey: Cappadocia is famous for its unique landscapes and historical sites. This caravanserai hotel in the region allows guests to stay in a cave-like room and experience the magic of Cappadocia. So this caravanserai doubles up as a cavehotel also. Radisson Blu Hotel, Tashkent, Tashkent, Uzbekistan: While not a traditional caravanserai, this modern hotel incorporates elements of Uzbekistan's historical architecture and design. It provides a comfortable and culturally immersive experience for travellers.

Caravanserai Beach Resort, Mombasa, Kenya: Located on Bamburi Beach in

Mombasa, this beachfront hotel is also not a traditional caravanserai. Rather, it is inspired by the concept of a caravanserai and offers a blend of traditional and modern African design.

Zein Od Din Caravanserai, Yazd, Iran: The hotel at Zein-od-Din, is a tastefully restored caravanserai from the Safavid Period, some 400 years ago. It is one of 999 caravanserais that is said to have been built in the 16th century during the reign of Shah Abbas I to provide facilities to travellers and traders on the Silk Road. Smallest hotel in the world

Determining the absolute smallest hotel in the world can be

challenging, as the title may change over time and depending on specific criteria. However, one of the world's smallest hotels in the world is the 'Eh'häusl' in Amberg, Germany. The Eh'häusl, which translates to 'Wedding House' in English, is a historic and charming building measuring just 2.5 meters (8.2 feet) wide. It is a tiny building, but has an interesting history.

The Eh'häusl was originally built in the 18th century, and its history is tied to a peculiar Bavarian law from that time. According to the law, a couple could only get married if they owned a house. To circumvent this requirement, some couples would buy the Eh'häusl jointly, get married, and then sell it. This allowed them to meet the legal requirement without the financial burden of owning a larger home.

The Eh'häusl is extremely small, with just one room on each of its five floors, making it a unique and cozy place to stay. It has been converted into a hotel with modern amenities, despite its diminutive size. Couples often stay at the Eh'häusl for romantic getaways, honeymoons, or to experience a piece of Bavarian history.

While the Eh'häusl might not offer the same level of luxury as larger hotels, its historical significance and charming atmosphere make it a popular and memorable destination for those interested in a unique and intimate lodging experience.

Deepest Hotel in the World

The underground suites of the Grand Canyon Caverns in Arizona, the US, located almost 220 feet below the ground, have, for some time, been known as 'the world's largest, deepest and darkest motel rooms'.

The claim for the deepest hotel was also made by the Shimao Wonderland Intercontinental (also known as the Shimao Quarry Hotel) which is located in a 288 feet-deep, water-filled, abandoned quarry. Located in Songjiang, Shanghai, China, this hotel has only two levels above ground, and 16 levels plunging into the quarry below. This luxury hotel that offers stunning views of the quarry's water and rock formations. It features a unique underground and underwater design and has a range of amenities, including restaurants, a spa, and even an underwater restaurant and suite that are submerged in a pool within the quarry.

The crown for the deepest hotel has now finally been taken over by Deep Sleep, a hotel that has recently been opened 1,375 ft below the mountains of Snowdonia in Wales. The place was once home to Snowdonia's abandoned slate mines, the largest of its kind in the whole world. Mining history here goes back to the year 1810. It is a labyrinth of tunnels and large and mystical caverns. The mine was operative till 1990; after being flooded, it was abandoned.

The hotel is basically a few log cabin rooms at the bottom of the mine. It can accommodate ten people. A feature that differentiates this underground hotel from all the rest of its kind is that there is no elevator to access it. Instead, one needs to go through a 45-minutes' hike from the Tanygrisiau base near Blaenau Ffestiniog to begin the journey through the caverns. It involves an element of adventure, and is impliedly, not for all. One must put on safety helmet, miner's lamp, harness and Wellington rubber boots before setting off for the caves. Along the way, one can see various remnants of this 19th-century mine, and memoirs of the miners, like old mine cars, decaying tracks, bridges, liquor bottles and so on.

There is a basic tour of the mine for anybody above 10 years of age. But the extremely difficult level of tour involving free falls and a run on the Goliath zip line is strictly for adults only. There are suspended cables connecting parts of the mines to get one safely and fast from one side to the other. This is also the world's longest underground zipline.

Highest Hotel in the World

Once the highest accommodation in the world was the Chacaltaya ski resort hut in Bolivia. It is no longer operational as ski activity in the area reduced after the glacier started melting. But it is interesting to know about this resort (the hut also featured in the cover of our first issue on accommodations from September 2014). Chacaltaya Ski Resort that stood at an altitude of 17,634 ft (5,375m) above sea level, had opened in the 1930s. It was also the world's highest ski resort and restaurant.

Today, the Tayka del Desierto, also in Bolivia, is regarded as the highest hotel in the world. It stands at an altitude of 15,091 ft (4,600m) above the sea level. Built with the surrounding volcanic rocks, it's the only settlement in the Siloli Desert, part of the Atacama (regarded as the most arid desert in the world). The hotel is located in the middle of the otherworldly Siloli Desert, in close proximity to the flamingo-filled Laguna Colorada, volcanic field of geysers called the Sol de Mañana and the bright green Laguna Verde lake.

India's highest altitude hotel is the Pangong Inn Hotel, located in close proximity to the Pangong lake, at an altitude of 14,270 feet (4,350m).

Quirkiest Hotel in the World

The entire issue has been dedicated to the most unusual hotels around the world. The following are some more quirky hotels that did not fall into any specific category discussed in the earlier articles. These hotels have also gained attention in recent years:

Dog Bark Park Inn, Cottonwood, Idaho, USA: Shaped like a colossal beagle, this whimsical bed and breakfast is a haven for dog enthusiasts, allowing guests to enjoy a cozy stay inside the dog-shaped building.

No Man's Fort, Solent, England: This converted sea fort in the Solent strait offers a luxurious and isolated experience, complete with a spa, rooftop hot tubs and activities like laser tag right in the middle of the sea.

The Caves, Negril, Jamaica: This boutique hotel is built into natural limestone cliffs, with rooms and suites that offer stunning ocean views thus creating an unforgettable seaside retreat.

nightstand placed in the middle of the Swiss Alps, allowing guests to enjoy the pure mountain air and have unparalleled stargazing opportunities.

Skylodge Adventure Suites, Sacred

Valley, Peru: These transparent pods are suspended on a cliffside and offer a thrilling and unconventional way to experience the breathtaking beauty of the Sacred Valley.

Ostrog Monastery, Montenegro: This 17th century monastery is literally built vertically on the rocks of Ostroška Greda in the mountains of Montenegro. One can reach here after a long hike from the nearest road. This is a pilgrimage place for many, and it is possible to stay here overnight. The accommodation is basic, with dormitories and communal wash areas consisting of one long trough.

Wine Barrel Hotels: Located in wine regions, these hotels offer guests the experience of staying in large wine barrels. Quinta da Pacheca in Portugal is one such example.

Train and Plane Hotels: Decommissioned trains and planes have been transformed into unique accommodations, such as the Train Lodge in Amsterdam and the Jumbo Stay in Stockholm, where guests can stay in a transformed Boeing 747.


